Showcase Patricks Road State School

Building on Foundations (Years 3 to 6)

Professional collaboration within the vibrant learning community at Patricks Road State School has driven significant improvements in student outcomes. In 2022, the school experienced a decline in student achievement in English. Leaders identified teaching and moderation practices were not consistent across the school. In response, they implemented a whole-school approach to literacy, aligned with the Australian Curriculum. This approach focused on evidence-based teaching, developing staff capability and consistent moderation practices, to ensure every student had an equal opportunity to succeed.



Some of the actions that led Patricks Road State School to be showcased in this category:

- Leaders analysed data, reviewed evidence-based research on teaching reading and consulted with Prep teachers.
- Leaders introduced an evidence-informed approach to teaching of reading through the Australian Curriculum, with a focus on systematic synthetic phonics (SSP) in Prep.
- Leaders and teachers collaboratively developed phonics kits, PowerPoints and other resources.
- The school established a systematic professional development program, including practical training and
- The Head of Curriculum and Speech Therapist modelled lessons to demonstrate best practices, followed by staff feedback and discussion.
- Leaders conducted regular walkthroughs, while coaches, including teachers and leaders, supported each year level.
- The school introduced consistent teaching routines for all students, focusing on grapheme and phoneme reviews and phonemic awareness practice. These routines emphasised reviewing, teaching, practising and applying
- The leadership team promoted teaching focused on A-level of achievement for English.
- Leaders prioritised time for teachers to moderate and collaboratively plan.
- The school's reading team is part of a Collaborative Learning Community, which shares podcasts and newsletters fortnightly. These resources include tips for families to support their children in reading.

Impact
